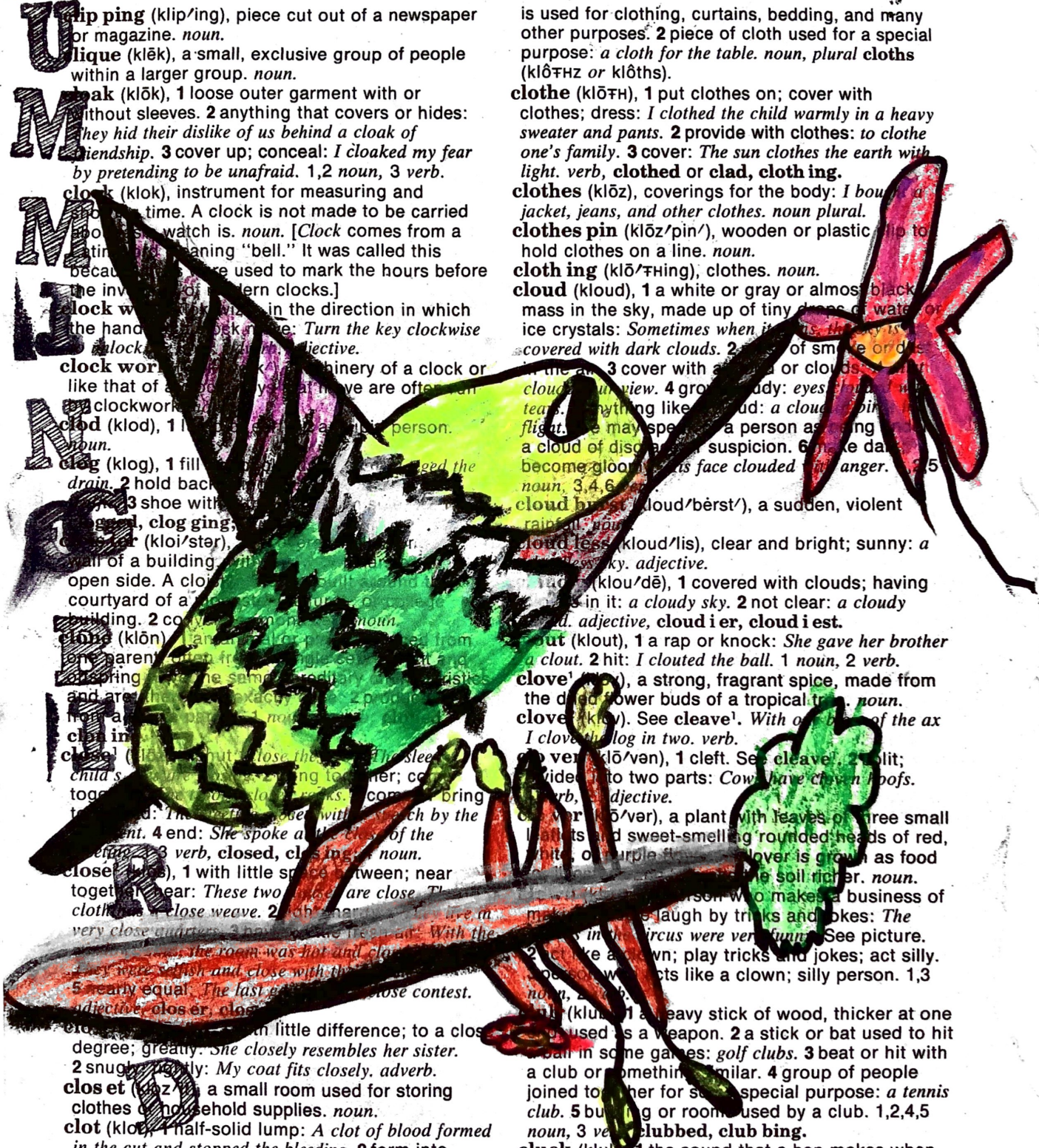

clipping (klip'ing), piece cut out of a newspaper or magazine. *noun*.
clique (klēk), a small, exclusive group of people within a larger group. *noun*.
cloak (klōk), 1 loose outer garment with or without sleeves. 2 anything that covers or hides: *They hid their dislike of us behind a cloak of friendship.* 3 cover up; conceal: *I cloaked my fear by pretending to be unafraid.* 1, 2 *noun*, 3 *verb*.
clock (klok), instrument for measuring and recording time. A clock is not made to be carried about; a watch is. *noun*. [Clock comes from a Latin word meaning "bell." It was called this because bells were used to mark the hours before the invention of modern clocks.]
clockwise (klok-wīz), in the direction in which the hands of a clock move: *Turn the key clockwise.* *adjective*.
clockwork (klok-worck), machinery of a clock or like that of a watch. *noun*.
clod (klot), 1 a mass of earth. 2 a person. *noun*.
clog (klog), 1 fill; block: *The mud clogged the drain.* 2 hold back; hinder: *The clogged shoe with the high heel.* 3 shoe with a high heel. *noun*.
clog ging (klog-ging), 1 the act of clogging. 2 a shoe with a high heel. *noun*.
cloud (kloud), 1 a white or gray or almost black mass in the sky, made up of tiny drops of water or ice crystals: *Sometimes when it rains, the sky is covered with dark clouds.* 2 a group of people or things: *A cloud of smoke or a cloud of anger.* 3 cover with a cloud or clouds: *The clouds hid the mountain.* 4 grow cloudy; eyes: *Her eyes were cloudy with tears.* 5 anything like a cloud: *a cloud of suspicion*. *noun*.
clouded (kloud'ed), 1 a person appearing a cloud of suspicion. 2 a person's face become gloomy: *His face clouded with anger.* *adjective*.
cloud burst (kloud'berst'), a sudden, violent rainfall. *noun*.
cloudless (kloud'lis), clear and bright; sunny: *a cloudless sky.* *adjective*.
cloudy (kloud'dē), 1 covered with clouds; having clouds in it: *a cloudy sky.* 2 not clear: *a cloudy mind.* *adjective*.
cloudier, **cloudiest**.
clout (klout), 1 a rap or knock: *She gave her brother a clout.* 2 hit: *I clouted the ball.* 1 *noun*, 2 *verb*.
clove (klov), a strong, fragrant spice, made from the dried flower buds of a tropical tree. *noun*.
clove (klov), See *cleave*¹. With *of*: *With a clove of the ax I clove the log in two.* *verb*.
clow (klō'ven), 1 cleft. See *cleave*². 2 split; divide into two parts: *Cow have cloven hoofs.* *verb*, *adjective*.
club (klub), 1 a plant with leaves of three small rounded heads of red, purple, and white flowers. 2 a flower is grown as food to help the soil richer. *noun*.
clown (klaun), 1 a person who makes a business of making people laugh by tricks and jokes: *The clowns in the circus were very funny.* See picture. 2 to make a clown; play tricks and jokes; act silly. *noun*, 2 *verb*.
club (klub), 1 a heavy stick of wood, thicker at one end, used as a weapon. 2 a stick or bat used to hit a ball in some games: *golf clubs.* 3 beat or hit with a club or something similar. 4 group of people joined together for some special purpose: *a tennis club.* 5 building or room used by a club. 1, 2, 4, 5 *noun*, 3 *verb*.
clubbed, **clubbing**.
cluck (kluk), 1 the sound that a hen makes when calling to her chickens. 2 make such a sound. 1 *noun*, 2 *verb*.
clue (klü), fact or object which aids in solving a mystery or problem: *The police could find no*

is used for clothing, curtains, bedding, and many other purposes. 2 piece of cloth used for a special purpose: *a cloth for the table.* *noun*, plural *cloths* (klōfthz or klōths).
clothe (klōfth), 1 put clothes on; cover with clothes; dress: *I clothed the child warmly in a heavy sweater and pants.* 2 provide with clothes: *to clothe one's family.* 3 cover: *The sun clothes the earth with light.* *verb*, **clothed** or **clad**, **clothing**.
clothes (klōz), coverings for the body: *I bought a jacket, jeans, and other clothes.* *noun plural*.
clothes pin (klōz'pin'), wooden or plastic pin to hold clothes on a line. *noun*.
clothing (klōfthing), clothes. *noun*.
